SCOPE AND NATURE OF THE POSITION

Crossways Lutheran School expects its staff to be highly professional and committed to continual improvement and best practice in education and pastoral care. Therefore, the Classroom Teacher will be an enthusiastic, encouraging and patient teacher who is willing to:

- 1. Thoroughly plan and prepare for teaching.
- 2. Maintain records as required.
- 3. Keep abreast of requirements in curriculum expressed by Lutheran Education Australia, and the Australian Curriculum.
- 4. Build respectful, productive, and cooperative relationships with students, colleagues, and parents. Meet appropriate duties as described within this statement in accordance with the Mission Statement, aims and values and the Industrial Agreements.

SCHOOL CONTEXT

Crossways is an ELC – Year 10 school with an enrolment of approximately 200 students. Crossways continues to respond to the growing demand of families from within our local community. In early 2019, the school opened an Early Learning Centre, which run programs for 3- and 4-year-olds based on the Reggio Amelia methodology- meaningful play, experiences of choice and tapping into children's own interests.

Our excellent facilities set amongst expansive grounds allows our wonderful students to enjoy the many academic, cultural, spiritual, and sporting opportunities that are available to them.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES:

The successful applicant will:

- 2. Develop positive working partnerships with students, parents, and colleagues to foster the development of the whole child (physical, academic, social, emotional and spiritual) in a supportive and effective classroom environment.
- 3. Demonstrate a commitment to their own professional development through involvement in regular staff meetings, professional development opportunities and personal reflection or study.
- 4. Support the development and/or improvement of the school's policies and procedures.
- 5. Actively support, and at times lead the devotional and worship aspects of the school.

The successful applicant will be expected to-

- strive to offer the children placed into your care a model that they can look up to and follow;
- set a good example of Christian living to all;
- maintain a high level of communication with School staff and the community;

- communicate information regularly to students, colleagues and parents regarding student needs, class activities and school organisation/operations;
- have a strong knowledge and understanding of contemporary pedagogical methods and displays use of these;

- perform other tasks as directed by the Principal.

- Plan, teach, assess and evaluate units of work based on current curriculum documents and school frameworks.
- Incorporate a variety of age appropriate teaching strategies to engage students in their learning.
- Cater for a range of student abilities through planning and classroom organisation, and draw on the support available in the school.
- Use of a range of assessment techniques to monitor students learning and inform planning.
- Record and report student progress and performance in accordance with the school's reporting framework.
- Integrate information and communication technologies and draw on a variety of resources to enhance student learning.
- Create and maintain a safe and challenging learning environment through the use of effective classroom and behaviour management skills.

Develop positive working partnerships with students, parents and colleagues ...

- Work in partnership with key staff such as the Principal, Deputy Principal, Curriculum Coordinator, Chaplain, to enhance student learning and wellbeing.
- Cooperatively plan, work with and support colleagues.

- Involve students in leading devotion/worship activities including school worship services which involve the St Paul's Lutheran congregation.

- use excellent communication & delegation skills;

- supervisor / mentor skills;

- have the ability to maintain confidentiality

REVIEW AND ACCOUNTABILITY

There will be a six (6) month probationary period applicable to this position.

The Principal, or his nominee, will monitor the progress of the supervisor/teacher and provide feedback as appropriate.

A personal and professional learning plan will be developed through the school's collaborative appraisal and recognition program.

The successful applicant will:

- be registered or have the ability to be registered with the SA Teachers Registration Board as a teacher.
- hold a current Certificate in First Aid for Schools
- have the ability to fulfil the requirements of the Lutheran Church of Australia's Safe Place Policy.
- If you are a teacher of the Christian Studies Curriculum, you must have (or be willing to attain) the accreditation required by the Lutheran Church of Australia.
